We will NO LONGER be collecting Fluorescent Bulbs at the Hazardous Waste Collections. The Goodhue County Recycling Center accepts fluorescent bulbs Monday-Friday, year-round. We are very sorry for the inconvenience.

A Household Hazardous Waste drop-off is available at the Goodhue County Recycling Center in Red Wing, from the first Monday in May through the last Friday in October. Hours of operation for the drop-off will be Monday through Friday (except holidays), from 8am until 3pm. Please utilize the drop-off as much as possible in order to prevent large crowds at the collection events listed above. There is a 10 gallon per person per day limit at the Red Wing drop-off. Thank you for your cooperation.

The Goodhue County Recycling Center is located at 3745 Highway 61 N in Red Wing (across Highway 61 from the Red Wing Shoe Factory).

### **ATVs DRIVING ON YARDS**

We have been receiving calls on ATVs/Golf Carts driving across private property, using private property as a short cut. <u>Unless you have permission from the property owner, this is not allowed</u>. If you are observed by Goodhue County Sheriff's Department, you could be stopped. **Per our ordinance**:

Motorized golf carts and ATVs shall only be operated on city owned streets, alleys, and county roads or county state-aid highways located within the boundaries of the city.

## NORTH ZUMBRO SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT UPDATE

While the State Legislature did not allocate funding for our sewer project, we are pleased that we are still in consideration for receiving federal funding support. Importantly, this development does **not** deter progress toward establishing the joint sewer district.

Participating in the **North Zumbro Sewer and Sanitation District (NZSSD)** remains the most costeffective and sustainable option for our community. To illustrate:

- **Going independently** would cost approximately **\$18-\$20 million** for construction and infrastructure.
- By contrast, **joining the NZSSD with bonding** reduces that cost to about **\$4 million, \$10 million without bonding funds**.
- The NZSSD will serve as the issuer and bearer of any bonds obtained to finance the construction of this project. At this time, the City of Goodhue is not in a financial position to assume any additional bond payment obligations.

The cost savings extend well beyond initial construction:

- Approximate annual **operating costs alone** would be around **\$210,000** if we went on our own.
- Within the NZSSD, these preliminary costs are projected to be **\$87,000** annually.

# CALL BEFORE YOU DIG - WHAT IS 811?

811 is the national call-before-you-dig phone number. Anyone who plans to dig should call 811 or go to <u>https://www.gopherstateonecall.org/</u> a few business days before digging to request that the approximate location of buried utilities be marked with paint or flags so that you don't unintentionally dig into an underground utility line.

811 protects you and your community! Hitting a buried line while digging can disrupt utility service, cost money to repair, or cause serious injury or death. Always contact your 811 center, wait the required time for utilities to respond to your request, and ensure that all utilities have responded to your request before putting a shovel in the ground. This is not only part of the building permit process for buildings, but also should be part of the installation of fences for footings.

**FYI - BUILDING PERMIT VIOLATION** (no permit obtained prior to work performed) - \$85 or Double Permit Fee/whichever is greater.
